

# Craft 1 - Easter pom pom sheep

You will need; cardboard, wool, scissors, glue.

- 1. Cut two cardboard rings with a diameter of 5.5cm
- 2. Cut out the middle of each circle around 2.5cm
- 3. Put the two card circles together and wind the wool around the circles until it is full
- 4. Using the scissors, snip carefully round the edge of the circle, cutting all the threads
- 5. Pass a piece of wool between the two circles and tie a tight knot
- 6. Ease the cardboard circles out and you should have a pom pom body
- 7. Draw a four legs on black card (keep these joined together as it will be easier to attach to your body)
- 8. Draw a face on the black card, add eyes, nose and mouth
- 9. Attach face and legs to the pom pom body

You now have a pompom sheep!

Why not try making other animals using a pom pom?













## Craft 2 - Easter Chick

You will need; a paper plate, yellow paper/card, feathers, pens/stickers

- 1. Cut the paper plate in half
- 2. Decorate with pens and/or stickers
- 3. Cut out an egg shape from yellow card (or use while and paint or colour it yellow!) this will be the chicks body
- 4 Add a beak, eyes and feathers to the chick
- 5 Stick the chick to the back of one of the paper plate halves
- 6. Using a split pin, attach the two halves of the plate so that it opens and closes over the chick.







### Craft 3 - Easter Card

Here are a few ideas for Easter cards -



Why not use a cross shape or cut your card to an Easter egg shape and decorate with stickers or colour with pens. These can be sent to someone you know to wish them a Happy Easter. Alternatively, you can design your own card.





# Craft 4 - Easter cooking: Here are a few recipes to try out.

#### 1. Easter Biscuits =

250g butter 140g caster sugar 300g sifted plain flour 1 egg yolk 2tsp vanilla extract

- Mix the butter and sugar together until its really light and fluffy.
- Add the egg yolk and vanilla to the mix
- Add half the flour and mix
- Add the rest of the flour and mix slowly (the dough should not be too wet)
- Knead the dough into a ball and put it in the fridge to chill for 30 minutes
- Roll out the dough to about the thickness of a pound coin
- Cut circles with the rim of a clean glass or use a cookie cutter
- Grease a baking tray and lay out the biscuits with a little gap between each one
- Bake in a preheated oven at  $180^{\circ}C$  (gas mark 4) for 12-15 minutes.
- Slide them off the tray and cool on a rack
- Decorate with yellow or pink icing and add a face to make a chick or bunny

#### 2. Easter Nests =

225g/8oz plain chocolate, broken into pieces 2 tbsp golden syrup 50g/2oz butter 75g/2¾oz cornflakes 36 mini chocolate eggs

- Line a 12-hole fairy cake tin with paper cases.
- Melt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water) or melt in a microwave
- Stir the mixture until smooth.
- Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.
- Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.









### Craft 5 - Easter wreath

You will need; some coloured card, glue, ribbon, paper plate (optional)

- 1. Cut out a circle of card or cut the middle out of a paper plate
- 2. Cut out egg shapes from different coloured card
- 3. Add stickers or decorate you eggs
- 4. Glue the egg shapes to the card circle
- 5. Add a ribbon and hang up!
